OFFICIAL INFORMATION ACT REQUEST 2022/30

On 25/08/22 you made a request under the Official Information Act 1982 (the OIA) for the following: Documentation held by your organisation that sets out:

- Your organisation's current salary bands;
- Which jobs fall into which of those salary bands;
- If your organisation has negotiated a collective agreement that provides for new salary bands that are not yet in effect, those salary bands; and
- If so, which jobs will fall into which of those not yet in effect salary bands;
- Any policy your organisation has re the position within a band at which a new appointee to a role will typically be placed.

The Electoral Commission does not have a policy on what level employees are to be appointed to in their bands. It is based on the levels of qualifications and experience. DCE or CEO approval is required for offers above 100% of the band with the one-up manager approval principal being applied.
