OFFICIAL INFORMATION ACT REQUEST 2023/39

On Wednesday 16 August 2023 you made a request under the Official Information Act 1982 (the OIA) for the following information:

I wish to seek a copy of all communications that the Electoral Commission has had with Harry Tam, as mentioned in the reply to Parliamentary Written Question 20116 (2023). For the phone call communications, I request all recollections from the phone call that the Electoral Commission staff members have. Where information is withheld, I request that you provide the title and date of the communication/document withheld, the reason for refusal, and the grounds in support of that reason as required by section 19(a) of the Official Information Act.

Part of the Commission's role is to raise awareness with the public on how to get ready to vote. This includes enrolment and voting period information. The Commission also addresses any barriers to participation through building community understanding of voting eligibility for all New Zealanders, why voting is important, and to support confidence for voters to take part.

Therefore, we include a broad range of communities in our planning and engagement activity. It is part of the Commission's statutory role to work with all communities to help them understand and take part in elections and support eligible voters to meet their legal obligation to be enrolled.

Below is a copy of the <u>WPQ 20116 (2023)</u> as a reference to your request with the respective email attachments (noted as appendices) aligned to the corresponding date(s). With regards to the 19/5/23 contact noted in the WPQ, this is a transcribed phone call made to our contact centre. Further to this, the emails provided make note of any phone calls and provide summaries of the conversations held.

26/6/23	Mr Tam was informed that the Commission would not provide funding for his travel costs. Emails exchanged regarding Maraenui and Dunedin hui.	Refer to Appendix 3
28/6/23	Phone call and follow up emails between Mr Tam and Commission regarding logistics for Dunedin meeting. The Commission responded noting: "The Electoral Commission remains neutral / apolitical at all times. Our team will remain onsite to assist with completion and collection of the enrolment forms. However, can they please be excused prior to your korero with your members."	Refer to Appendix 4
1/7/23	Dunedin hui at Corstophine Community Hub, 40-50 people in attendance alongside two Commission staff. The Commission presented information related to the Māori Electoral Option, the difference between the Māori and general roll, the difference between Māori and general electorates, voting, and enrolment. Participants were provided with enrolment forms. Commission staff left the room while the hui continued, returning to collect completed enrolment forms once the hui was concluded	Refer to Appendices 2, 2.1, 3 & 4
4/7/23	Email from Commission to Mr Tam acknowledging that Commission staff would not be able to attend upcoming events in Waipawa or Maraenui	Refer to Appendices 2, 2.1, 3 & 5
